

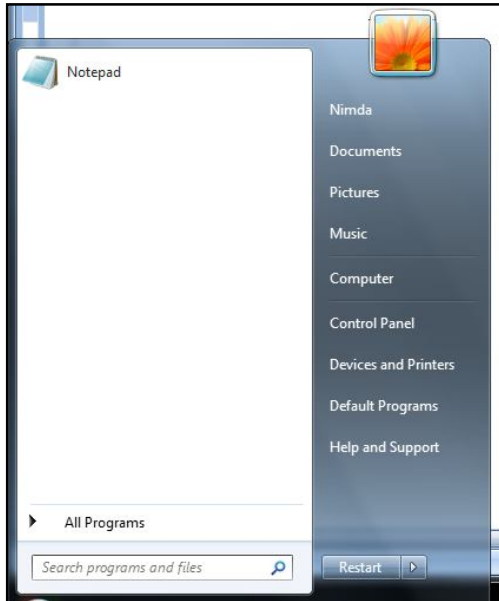
# How to Determine if Your Computer is Part of a Domain - Windows 7

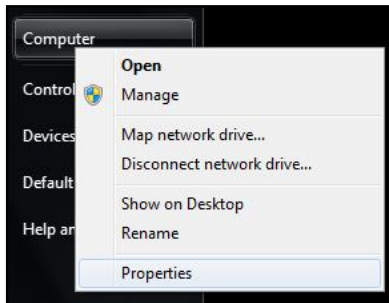
1. Click the Windows Start button:



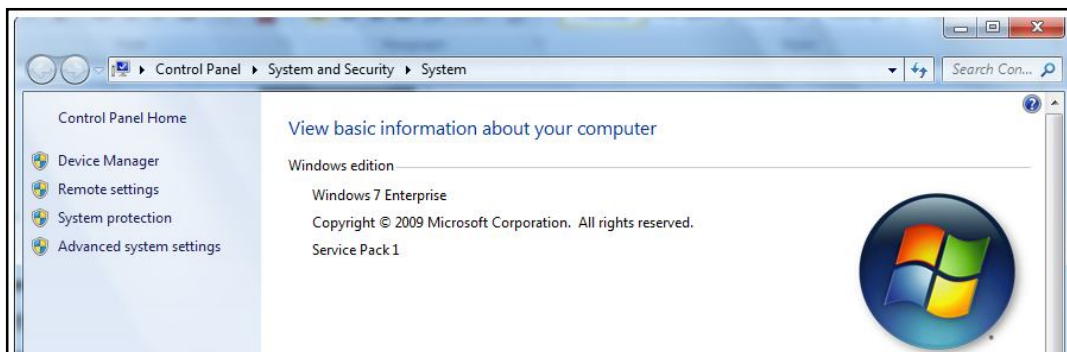
2. The Start Menu appears:
